**PURPOSE**

To repeal the 2019 legislation which mandated that the City adopt in toto the State Procurement Code for all of its purchasing activities.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

In 2019, the Council approved legislation which, among other things, mandated that the City adopt in toto the Louisiana State Procurement Code as a part of managing its procurement activities. Experience since then has shown that the State Code is not particularly useful as a guide for our purchasing efforts. It is lengthy and complex, deals with many situations we never encounter and is cumbersome to keep current. As an example, there is an amendment proposed in this year's Legislative session that runs 26 pages. The Council already has adopted legislation that requires changes to the City's Purchasing Rules and Regulations to be approved by resolution. The Rules and Regulations contain sufficient detail to allow them to be used as the City's guide for procurement, while the State Bid Law sets threshold levels where very specific methods must be used to obtain commodities and execute public works contracts of a certain size. Repealing this requirement would eliminate an unnecessary extra step in procurement compliance.
