**A RESOLUTION CELEBRATING COURTLAND T. MILLOY, SR. 100TH BIRTHDAY,
AND OTHERWISE PROVIDING WITH RESPECT THERETO**

WHEREAS, Courtland T. Milloy Sr, native of Earle, Arkansas, was born on October 21, 1924; and

WHEREAS, Milloy received his early education in the public schools of both Arkansas and St. Louis, Missouri, and his Bachelor of Science degree in Commercial Industries, with a minor in Business; and

WHEREAS, after graduating Milloy accepted a teaching position at Booker T. Washington High School. While continuing his teaching career, he earned a Master of Arts degree in Journalism; and

WHEREAS, Milloy opened Graphic Arts Center, a small studio and duplicating business. He eventually retired from the school system to work full time; and

WHEREAS, in 1984, he purchased property on the corner of Milam Street and Lewis Place, and changed the name to Milloy's Photo-Graphics, he incorporated the business in 1986 and it became Milloy's Photo-Graphics Inc.; and

WHEREAS, after 45 years of continuous operation, he closed his business. To honor him for his devoted service, the 2300 block of Milam Street was dedicated to Courtland T. Milloy, Sr.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Shreveport in due regular and legal session convened, that the City of Shreveport joins the Milloy family in celebration of Courtland T. Milloy Sr.'s 100th birthday.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any provision of item of this resolution or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications of this resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or applications and to this end the provisions of this resolution are hereby declared severable.
