**PURPOSE**

To adopt the 2024 Solid Waste Fund budget.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The proposed 2024 budget for the Solid Waste Fund is \$19,854,900, up 24% from 2023's original budget but less than is actually expected to be spent in 2023. The budget includes \$1,480,000 from a planned Certificate of Indebtedness to purchase five replacement packers. The City's General Fund contribution of \$3,924,900 is considerably less than the \$9 million required in 2023 (some of which reflects the costs of the storm debris cleanup effort). Part of that is because the monthly charge for garbage collection is proposed to be increased from \$7 to \$10. This increase generates about \$2.4 million in annual revenue, which reduces the General Fund subsidy – this freeing up General Fund monies to be used for such priority items as pay adjustments for City employees, incentives to improve Police and Fire retention, street maintenance and property standards enforcement. If the City Council chooses not to increase this fee or to approve a lesser amount, cuts in at least some of these areas will be needed. This increase does not mean that Solid Waste revenues will cover fully the cost of operations and equipment. That would require a monthly fee of \$17-\$18.
